Board of Directors and Advisory Council Responsibilities

- Know the organization
- Have dreams for the organization
- Fundraise and support HRYR generously – a minimum of \$25.00 a month is required
- Recruit and nominate others
- Review minutes and other information sent, prior to board meetings
- Required to attend all quarterly board retreats
- Required to sponsor a table at the yearly fundraising banquet –
- Required to attend Board training with the United Way of the Piedmont
- Required to serve on at least one board committee
- Required to volunteer at the ranch for a minimum of one week prior to serving
- Ask questions, get engaged
- Suggest agenda items and “own” the board meetings
- Avoid conflict of interest and never accept or offer gifts to anyone who does business with the organization
- Participate in ministry activities (board meetings; volunteer at ranch; special meetings and events; etc.)
- Attend all board meetings (unless it is an emergency). A board member is given 3 absences. If you miss more than 3 board meetings you may be subject to dismissal from the board. If you are going to be absent from a meeting you must call the Secretary or Executive Director prior to the meeting.
- You are to live a Christian life style at all times.
- You are to be an active member in a Bible Believing Christian church.

- Assess Performance of the Executive Director/CEO and other Board Members
- Ensure Effective Organizational Planning

- Enhance the Organization’s Public Standing

ADVISORY BOARD AND CONSULTING COUNCIL – HOPE REMAINS YOUTH RANCH, INC.

1.1 Purpose – The Board of Directors has established an Advisory Council in an effort to add measures to protect the original vision and mission of why Hope Remains Youth Ranch, Inc. was created. The Advisory Council has been established to serve as a consultative and advisory body to provide valuable input to the Board of Directors on matters related to the mission, objectives and goals of the ministry. In addition, the Advisory Council provides the means for discussing and evaluating Hope Remains affairs and provides the opportunity for reporting on, exchanging ideas about, and evaluating the activities and programs. The Advisory Council members will be considered for Board of Director openings.

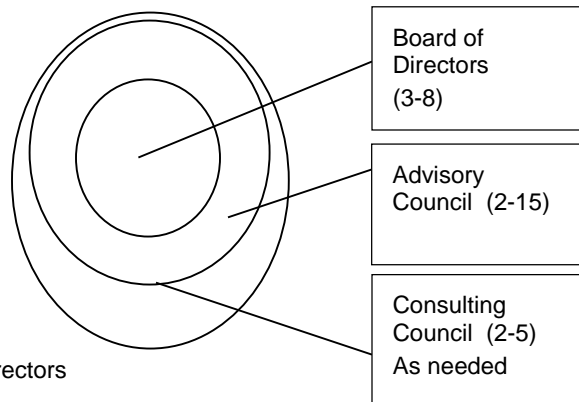
1.2. Terms and requirements

- (a) The Advisory Council shall consist of up to a total 15 members who are not members of the Board of Directors;
- (b) Members of the Advisory Council shall be elected by the Board of Directors.
- (c) In order to ensure continuity, the Board shall determine if new members are to be elected annually.
- (d) A person shall become a member of the Advisory Council on the date of election until December 31st of the following year.

The primary duty of the Advisory Council is advising and consulting with the Board of Directors.

Duties Include:

- Providing advice on how Hope Remains can be relevant in other cultures nationally and globally
- Assisting in growing Hope Remains' network of Partners, affiliates, and alliances
- Providing advice and recommendations regarding business and ministry objectives.
- Providing expertise in areas specified by the Board of Directors
- Will participate in the annual Board meeting
- Will not have voting rights at the Board meetings. Voting rights are limited to the Board of Directors.
- The Advisory Council or individual members may be available to be called upon from time to time if an urgent need arises.



1.3. Levels of Membership

- Advisory Council Member
 - May be invited to Executive Board of Directors Meetings
 - Are required to serve on a standing committee and/or special meetings
 - Are required to attend all Board meetings and all board retreats
- Consulting Council Member
 - May be invited to Executive Board of Directors meetings
 - Will be asked to serve on the committee for the particular project of which he/she has given advisory

- 1.4. The President/Founder/Executive Director/CEO shall chair the Advisory Council and the Consulting Council.
- 1.5. Recommendations of the Advisory Council and the Consulting Council shall be made individually or as a group as determined by the Board of Directors as the situation calls for.
- 1.6. The Secretary of the Board of Directors shall keep records of the Advisory Council and the Consulting Council membership, of the term of office for each Advisory Council and Consulting Council member, and of the minutes of the meetings held by the Advisory Council and Consulting Council.
- 1.7. The members of the Advisory Council and the Consulting Council shall receive updated information as necessary by the Office of the President/Founder/Executive Director/CEO.
- 1.8. The members of the Advisory Council and Consulting Council shall not have a fiduciary responsibility to Hope Remains Youth Ranch, Inc.

Hope Remains Youth Ranch - Statement of Faith

The Bible:

The Bible is the only infallible, inspired, authoritative Word of God. All Scripture is given by inspiration of God. The Bible is truth without error. We accept its authority over every area of our lives. Through it we come to know God as revealed in the person of Jesus Christ.

God:

God is the Creator of all things. There is only one God, eternally existent in three persons: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. He is perfect, eternal, all knowing, all-powerful, and present everywhere, full of Grace and Truth. He revealed Himself through Jesus Christ the Messiah, who was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, died on the cross as the full payment for the sins of all who believe, rose from the dead, sits at the right hand of God the Father and is coming again according to God's plan in victory and in glory.

Man:

Man is the special creation of God, made in His own image. He created them male and female as the crowning work of His creation. By his free choice man disobeyed, therefore, sinned against God and brought sin into the human race. The sacredness of human personality is evident in that God created man in His own image, and in that Christ willingly died for man in order for man to be able to again have fellowship with God the Father; therefore every person of every race possesses dignity and is worthy of respect and Christian love.

Salvation:

Salvation involves the redemption, restoration, of the whole man- body, soul, and spirit. It is offered freely to all who willing believe and accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. Salvation is by faith alone. It is neither earned nor deserved it is a gift offered through God's grace. This gift was made possible through Jesus Christ who by shedding His own blood obtained eternal redemption for the believer. Salvation is a ONE time definite action accepted by man through choice and belief in the finished work of Christ on the Cross. In its broadest sense salvation includes regeneration, justification, sanctification, and glorification.

The Church:

The Church is composed of all those who truly believe on the Lord Jesus Christ. It is the body and the bride of Christ. The Bible instructs believers to be an active participant in the Church. Members of one body, the church, who are responsible to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

Holy Spirit:

Every believer receives the Holy Spirit the MOMENT he accepts Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. The Holy Spirit lives within the believer empowering them to choose to reject sin and follow Christ. His role is Teacher, Comforter, Revealer, and Convicter of sin. He is the influencing Power that enables the believer to grow in Christ-likeness while on the earth.

Baptism:

The action of water Baptism is the outward symbol of what God has already done in a person's life through salvation. It identifies the believer as a follower of Jesus Christ and a member of His Kingdom. This baptism is not necessary for salvation because salvation comes through faith of the believer of Jesus' life, death, burial, resurrection, and His promised return.
